### Leader Notes

**Bible Passage:** God will Always Love Me- John 21

**Bottom Line:** God loves us no matter what.

**Leader Context:** There's no sin too big that will stop God from loving us. As we see in how Jesus responded to Peter in John 21, God loves us no matter what. And that love changes us and makes us excited to tell others.

**THE WIN FOR SUNDAY GROUPS:** Give kids a first look at The Bible, Jesus, and our need for a Savior by embracing their physical needs or engaging their interests. Use The Code when necessary to help redirect kids and build relationships.

**Read-** John 21

**Highlight:** John 21:15

**Reflect-** What action do you feel like God wants you to take as you reflect on His forgiveness?

- Allow the joy of His love and forgiveness to be the loudest in my heart and mind.
- Look at others through the lens of His desire to show love and forgiveness.
- Confess the sin I've been struggling with and receive His forgiveness.

**Pray:** Thank You, Jesus for forgiving me- especially since I haven't done anything to deserve Your forgiveness. Like Peter, help me to listen to Your call to show my love for You by sharing You with those around me.

**Prepare:** What are some things you're not proud of that you are thankful to Jesus for forgiving? Is there anyone that would benefit from hearing your story and seeing God's love on display?
