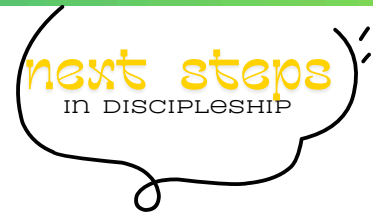

Armor of God- Put on all the armor God gives you so you can stand strong when things get tough. With God's help, you can stay strong and do what's right no matter what happens. Eph 6:13

Bible- Apr 6- Luke 22:47-53; John 18:1-11 We fight evil with peace.

Read: Ephesians 6:10-12, 15; Luke 22:47-53; John 18:1-11

In This Passage: Paul talks about the spiritual battle we're fighting against evil and tells us to put on the shoes of peace that comes from the good news about Jesus. Just as shoes help a soldier walk safely in a battle, the shoes of peace help us when we face evil. Jesus chose to walk in peace even when his enemies arrested him. Though his friend Peter wanted to fight with violence, Jesus chose peace.

Bible Point: We fight evil with peace.

Memory Verse: "Therefore, put on every piece of God's armor so you will be able to resist the enemy in the time of evil. Then after the battle you will still be standing firm" (Ephesians 6:13).

Dig Deeper

You'll Be Teaching: We fight evil with peace. The words fight and peace might seem like opposites to kids. Help them see that fighting evil doesn't have to mean violence. In fact, one of the best ways God equips us in the battle against evil is with the shoes of peace!

Think About: What's a situation in your life where it feels like peace is losing? Give it to God and ask for his shoes of peace.

Dig In to Prayer

Ask God to put the shoes of peace on each of your kids' feet.

Quick Tip

How much peace is there in your classroom? It's natural for conflicts to arise between kids. And often, we as adults want to step in and resolve the conflict for them. Instead, save your energy for the bigger conflicts. For smaller things, such as "She won't share the toy!" teach kids problem-solving skills like listening well or reaching a compromise together. Let the kids try out the skills to actually find peace. (For older kids who've learned these skills, just say, "That sounds like a conflict you two can resolve on your own.")
