God Knows Me Inside and Out Leader Weekly Devotion

Leader Notes

Bible Passage: God Heard the Israelites (Exodus 3-4)

Bottom Line: God knows me and He hears me what I talk to Him.

Leader Context: We are known by God, and God hears us. God heard Moses and the Israelites in Exodus 2-4, and He always hears us too. Kids may be feeling alone or wondering if anyone is listening to them. We get to help them see that God hears us when we ask for His help. He knows our struggles and the things that are important to us. Just like God hear the people of Israel and sent Moses, God knows that we need a Savior, so He sent Jesus.

THE WIN FOR SUNDAY GROUPS: Give kids a first look at The Bible, Jesus, and our need for a Savior by embracing their physical needs or engaging their interests. Use The Code when necessary to help redirect kids and build relationships.

Study

Read- Exodus 3-4

Highlight: Exodus 3:7-8

Just like how God heard Moses and the Israelite, He always hears us. Even though God's answer didn't come in Israel's timing, that didn't mean God wasn't listening. God always hears us. He knows what we need and the timing of when we need it, and we can trust Him, even if the answer takes longer than we anticipate.

Reflect- In what areas do you need to remember that God hears you?

- Bringing my needs and requests to Him.
- Claiming His promises over my life.
- Celebrating answered prayers.

Pray: God thank You that You always hear me. Help me to always cry out to You, to trust that You listen and to watch for the ways that You answer.

Prepare: What is a story about God hearing you that you can share with others on your team?

Leader Tips
