

Emergency Evacuation Procedures

In the event of an emergency, here are the procedures that may be followed for the different emergency situations possible;

1) Medical Attention Required:

In the event a camper, volunteer, and or staff member has a "non life threatening" injury or sickness requiring medical attention, they will first be evaluated by our resident EMT and/or volunteer first aid attendant. Transportation for the patient by boat from the camp to the nearest commercial flight to Fairbanks Memorial Hospital will be provided. The total time duration for this river / flight transportation will differ depending on the village community providing the commercial flight; from 2 to 4 hours.

2) Life Threatening Medical Attention Required:

In the event a camper, volunteer, and/or staff member has a "life threatening" injury or sickness requiring medical attention, they will be first evaluated by our resident EMT and/or volunteer first aid attendant. Emergency transportation (Medivac) will be arranged by satellite phone. The patient will be transported by boat from camp to a nearby airstrip where a chartered flight will take the patient directly to Fairbanks Memorial Hospital. The total time duration this river / flight transportation will differ depending on the village community providing the commercial flight; 1 to 1.5 hours. In the event a helicopter flight is dispatched, the travel time from the camp property can be less than 1 hour.

3) Flood:

In the event there is a flood that threatens the property and/or people on the camp grounds / facilities, TGM water craft as well as support water craft will be utilized to safely transport campers, staff, etc. to higher ground.

4) Wild Fire:

In the event there is a wild fire that threatens the property and/or people on the camp grounds / facilities, TGM water craft as well as support water craft will be utilized to safely transport campers, staff, etc. to a safe nearby island where emergency transportation can be arranged.

5) Personal Emergency:

In the event there is a personal emergency that requires a camper and/or staff member to leave the camp environment, appropriate measures will be followed according to the severity of the situation or need; i.e. death or fatal sickness of an immediate family member. Death or severe sickness of an immediate family member would qualify as first priority. A family member and/or friend missing a student would qualify as a lower priority.

6) Firearm Policy:

Only certified staff will be allowed to carry firearms for the safety of the camp residents. Visitors, support staff, volunteers, and campers will not be allowed to have firearms and/or uncertified weapons on the property. All TGM staff will complete a NRA *Bear Defense Class*, obtaining that certificate of completion. Law Enforcement officers in good standing will be the exception to this rule.

7) Removal:

In the event a camper, volunteer, support staff, or staff member becomes a threat to others residents of the camp in any physical and/or verbal fashion, transportation will be arranged to remove that individual from the camp property, at their expense.
