Life Check: My Responsibility
Study Questions

1. God's Word produces transformation in us. Looking at your life right now, can you see the tangible fruit of God's Word changing your character? What is one specific area where you need to allow His Word and His Holy Spirit to transform you to be more like Him?

2. Mature and responsible men are dependable in both word and deed, and God views casual or empty promises as a serious matter. Does the fear of man or the desire to be liked cause you to compromise the truth? How can you develop the courage to speak a polite, honest "no" instead of a dishonest "yes"?

3. Jesus states that *"whatever is in your heart determines what you say,"* and that we will give an account for every idle word. When you evaluate your daily speech, conversations, and commitments, what does the "fruit" of your words reveal about the current state of your heart? Are your words consistently producing good things from a good treasury?

4. The text challenges us by stating that punctuality is a direct sign of what we consider valuable. If we can make it to work, concerts, or sporting events on time, our lateness to worship reflects our true priorities. When you examine your timeliness—especially regarding church and spiritual commitments—what does it communicate about what (or who) you value most?

5. We are called to be men of courage, honor, fidelity, and responsibility—and to be the leaders of our families. In what ways can you better model responsibility and dependability to your family or those under your influence? What is one practical adjustment you can make today to live out these qualities and instill them in others?
