Study Questions

1. What do you think God would say is your best character trait and why?

2. Have you ever felt spiritually dehydrated? Identify the things that pulled you away from Jesus and think about steps you can take to reconnect with Him.

3. In what situations do you find it hardest to **love** others, and why?

4. How can you trust God to cultivate **joy** in your life even in seasons of loss or uncertainty?

5. What is the biggest stealer of your **peace**? If you are able to recognize it, then why do you continue to allow it to be stolen in those situations? How can you surrender it to God?

6. How do you respond when God's timing doesn't match your expectations in situations and with others? Are you as **patient** with Him as He is with you?

7. Do you extend the same **kindness** towards strangers, people at church and to those that are closest to you? If not, how is it different and why?

8. Are you willing to do what is **good** in the eyes of God, even when it will cost you something? Why or why not?

9. How can you reflect God's unwavering **faithfulness** in your commitments to others?

10. Who in your life needs to experience **gentleness** from you right now, and what would that look like in action?

11. What habits or desires challenge your **self-control** the most? How can you rely more on the Holy Spirit to strengthen your discipline in that area?
