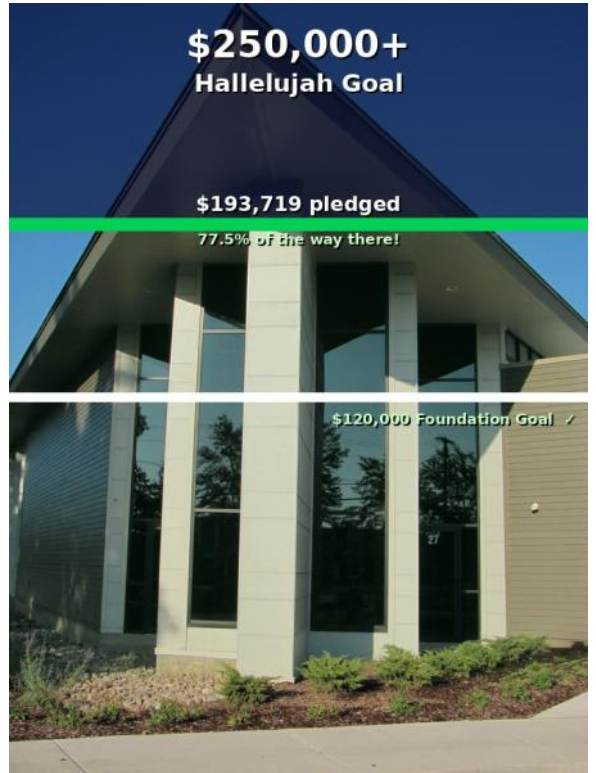

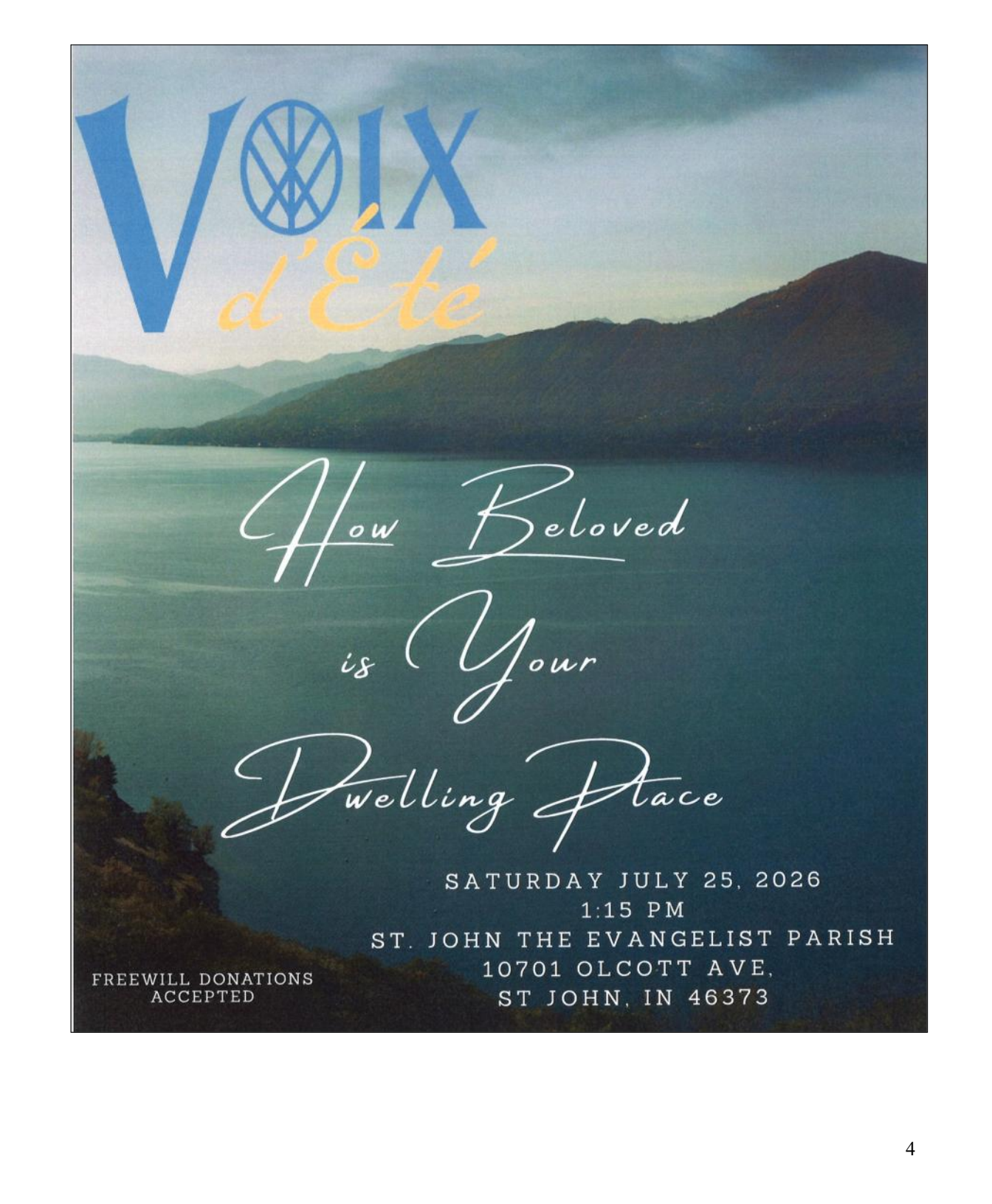

Gail Mannington (Board member and Treasurer), regularly undertakes Medical Mission trips to Guatemala and Honduras. AMOS is thrilled to announce another AMOS mission to Central America, warmly welcoming our 2026 team of dedicated volunteers! We're set to depart for Esquipulas, Guatemala on November 6th, 2026, this team is ready to make a lasting impact!

On each trip AMOS provides medical clinics, health care, speech pathology services and education. During each trip the team sees and treats hundreds of patients during clinic days, and the needs are voluminous. AMOS raises funds to purchase and provide prescription medications, ointments, and vitamins, and also collects over-the-counter medications for the mission team to take (CLC members have donated hundreds of pounds of over-the-counter medicines).

As much as we love summer, school supplies are already in the stores! And, as always, we will be collecting for Lutheran World Relief. Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children — and in some cases, adults — continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. Learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities. Kits are distributed worldwide, even in the US when disaster strikes. Our goal this year is to collect enough supplies through early October for 120 kits, each kit containing the following:

FOUR – 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper (approx. 8” x 10 ½”, not loose-leaf paper).

ONE – 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.

ONE – pencil sharpener.

ONE – pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well).

FIVE – **unsharpened** #2 pencils with erasers.

FIVE – black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink).

ONE – box of 16 or 24 crayons.

ONE – 2.5" eraser.

Quarterly Statements

THANK YOU for your generosity to the ministries of Christ Lutheran Church! Your support of our ministries allows us to bring the love of Christ to our local community and beyond. As you can see, we are a busy congregation, even during the summer!

Christ Lutheran is investing in our mission, locally and globally:

- Little Lamb Preschool's annual STEAM camp inspires faith, creativity, and curiosity.
- Lutheran Braille Workers and Lutheran World Relief Quilters gather in our Fellowship Hall to produce Bibles and quilts that are shipped around the world.
- Alcoholics Anonymous, Gamblers Anonymous, grief support group, Stephen Ministries and other groups rely on our generosity for meeting space.
- The Indiana-Kentucky Synod supports ministries throughout Indiana and Kentucky, funded in part by mission support gifts from congregations like ours (\$8,000 in the second quarter).
- CoAction, Reconciling Works, LGBTQ Outreach of Porter County, Project Neighbors, and Food Bank of Northwest Indiana serve our neighbors in northwest Indiana, funded in part by our support (\$9,186 in the second quarter).

Christ Lutheran is caring for our space and our people:

- Confirmation camp at Lutherwald encourages our youth to deepen their faith.
- Trivia Night is an evening of fellowship and friendly competition that raises funds for our youth ministry (\$1,591 in the second quarter).
- Family Faith Gatherings bring all generations together for food, fellowship, and service.
- Little Lamb Preschool welcomes Laura Venstrom as our new Director.
- We celebrate with our congregation's graduates and retirees - including Jen Gottlieb, who faithfully served as Director of Little Lamb Preschool for ten years - as they move on to new adventures.
- Sunday School, education hour classes, confirmation, Fusion, Circle, book groups, Bible studies, and fellowship groups nurture our faith and growth.

Christ Lutheran is joyfully worshipping our Lord:

- We worship together as one congregation in one service during the summer.
- Weeknight evening prayer on the back patio offers peace, renewal, and fellowship.

Christ Lutheran is committing to good stewardship of our resources:

- Our Ministry Plan for the 2026-2027 fiscal year challenges us to raise \$992,372 to fund the ministries of this congregation and repay \$11,400 borrowed from our restricted funds.
- Our "Dare to Disciple!" stewardship campaign raised \$479,334 to fund our Ministry Plan.
- Our Sheltered in Grace special appeal raised \$190,144 to fund the new roof over our sanctuary and significantly reduce the balance of our mortgage.
- A grant of \$20,000 from the John W. Anderson Foundation will help fund major property expenses.

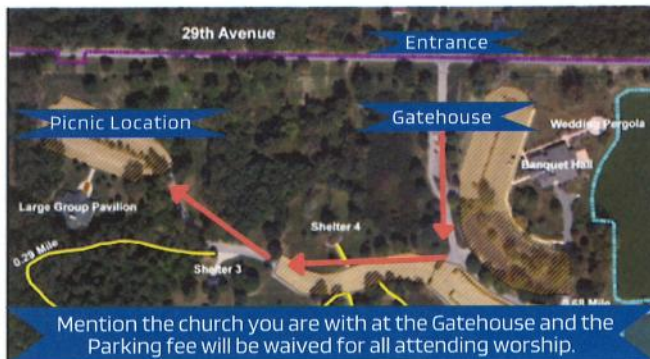

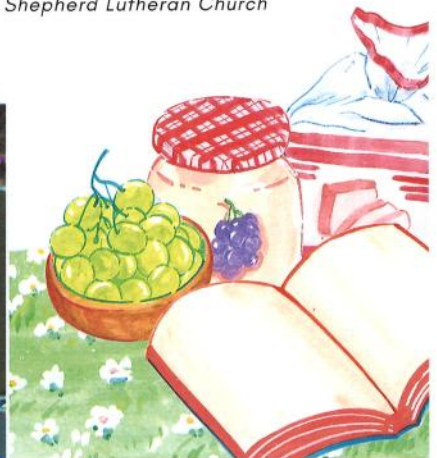
