Daniel: Uncommon Faith in an Evercompromising World

Standing Firm Without Losing Grace

Daniel refused to compromise his convictions, but he approached those in authority with humility, honor, and respect. Why do you think how we take a stand for our faith matters? Where in your life might God be calling you to stand firm while still showing grace to those who disagree with you?

Who Is Shaping Your Identity?

Daniel and his friends were given new names as part of an attempt to reshape their identity and loyalty, yet they remained rooted in who they were and whom they belonged to. What voices or influences in our culture compete to define our identity today? How can we make sure God's truth has the loudest voice in our lives?

Faith Over Fear

When Daniel faced resistance to his request, he didn't allow fear to stop him. Instead, he saw the situation as an opportunity to trust God. What fear is currently keeping you from stepping out in faith? What might change if you began viewing that situation as an opportunity for God to work?

Depending on God's Strength

The sermon challenges us to consider where we may be operating in our own strength instead of depending on the Lord. What is one area of your life where you tend to rely most on yourself? What would practically depending on God in that area look like this week?

Turning Everyday Places Into Sacred Spaces

God has positioned each of us in everyday places where our faith, integrity, work ethic, and love can point others toward Him. Where has God already positioned you to influence others? Who is one person in that space you can intentionally show the character of Christ to this week?

Prayer Prompt

Lord, give us the courage to stand firm in our faith while showing grace, humility, and love to those around us. Help us find our identity in You, trust Your strength instead of our own, and recognize the opportunities You give us to make a difference. Use us in the everyday places You have positioned us so that our lives point others to Jesus. Amen.
