Daniel: Uncommon Faith in an Evercompromising World

Why do you think Nebuchadnezzar asked someone to tell him his dream instead of telling them the dream first? What was he afraid of by telling them his dream?

Daniel's first response when he hears about needing to interpret and tell Nebuchadnezzar the dream he had is to plead to God and seek out His mercy. Why is it so important for us as Christians to seek out Jesus in those times that seem impossible?

How does Daniel 2 illustrate God's control over history and world events?

Discuss the symbolism behind the statue in the dream. How can it be applied to our understanding of world events? How does the stone not made by human hands represent the kingdom of God?

Notice in telling and interpreting the dream of Nebuchadnezzar that Daniel points back to God who gave him this wisdom and discernment and who is establishing His kingdom. In a culture that tells you to do whatever it takes to get power and climb the ladder, how can Daniel's action influence us?

What is the significance of King Nebuchadnezzar acknowledging God?
