We are Epic Life: Expectant Faith

Living With Expectation

Simeon lived each day believing God would fulfill His promise, and that expectation shaped the way he lived. The sermon describes expectant faith not simply as a feeling, but as a readiness for God to move. What would change about the way you approach your everyday life if you genuinely woke up expecting God to move? Where have you stopped expecting God to do something?

Trusting God While You Wait

Simeon waited faithfully for something he had not yet seen, confidently trusting that what God had promised would eventually become reality. Waiting can make it difficult to hold onto hope. What are you currently waiting on God for, and what would it look like to remain faithful and expectant even when you don't know when—or how—He will answer?

Attuned to the Holy Spirit

The sermon reminds us that “expectant faith is always a faith attuned to the Holy Spirit.” Simeon was able to recognize what God was doing because he had learned to listen and respond to the Spirit's leading. What helps you become more aware of the Holy Spirit's leading in your everyday life? What distractions, habits, or priorities might be making it harder for you to hear and respond to Him?

Faithful Through Every Season

Anna experienced tremendous loss, yet she remained devoted to God through worship, fasting, and prayer. Instead of allowing pain or disappointment to steal her hope, she continued looking forward to what God would do. How have disappointment, loss, or unanswered prayers affected your expectations of God? What can we learn from Anna about remaining hopeful and faithful through difficult seasons?

Ready for God to Move

The sermon challenges us to ask, “Am I ready for God to fulfill that promise today?” Expectant faith doesn't just believe God can move—it prepares our lives as though we believe He actually will. Is there an area where you say you trust God but aren't actually living with expectation? What is one practical step you could take this week to prepare your heart and life for God to move?

Prayer Prompt

Lord, help us live each day with expectant faith, trusting that You are faithful to fulfill Your promises. Teach us to recognize the leading of the Holy Spirit and remain hopeful and faithful even in seasons of waiting. Prepare our hearts to see You move in us, around us, and through us each day. Amen.
