The Day of Small Things

Solomon's temple was a large, magnificent edifice. Sixty-seven years after its
destruction, workers began rebuilding a new temple under the leadership of
Zerubbabel, Haggai, and Zechariah. Knowing that some looked with con-
tempt on the new temple God asked, "Who has despised the day of small
things?" (Zechariah 4:10). If God could rejoice in a smaller temple, why
could His people not rejoice too?

Throughout history, God has used small things to bring about great events:

- 1. Aaron's rod was a shepherd's rod. With a rod any shepherd could prod stub-
born sheep in the right direction or he could bash the skull of a lion or wolf
who threatened the flock. Moses' rod became the physical symbol of the sav-
ing power of God. In Moses' hands the rod became an instrument of punish-
ment for Pharaoh and of salvation for Israel.
2. The Widow's Mites were not even worth a penny. It was the smallest of
change under the Jewish system. Her contribution into the treasury indicates
just how poor she was because Jesus said it was all she had (Mark 12:44).
While some might look with contempt upon her contribution, her gift has
stirred many acts of generosity over the centuries.
3. Paul's pen proved to be mightier than the sword. While under house arrest
and limited in movement (Acts 28), Paul's epistles were able to go beyond
boundaries of time and space. Countless people have been saved by reading
his letters. Many a discouraged soul has found comfort in Paul's words. The
proverb is true: "What is spoken lasts but for a day; what is written lasts for-
ever."

God takes what we treat lightly and performs the mightiest acts, the noblest
deeds, and the greatest of all events. Whether it is Dorcas' needle or the lad's
loaves and fishes, God is able to use anything we offer to Him no matter how
small. What small thing is in your hand? A dollar? A sympathy card? A pot
luck dish? A cell phone? Use it for the glory of God.

Just because something is small, is no reason to ignore it. Even a journey of a
thousand miles begins with one small step.

Sympathy


