The Most "Unique" Book in All the World

Unique: 1. One and only one; single, sole. 2. Different from all others; having no like or equal (*Websters New World Dictionary*).

The Bible has to be the most "unique" book in the world!

First of all, the Bible was penned by men from different walks of life.

- Some were statesmen (i.e. kings, prime ministers, cup-bearers).
- Some were from a "working class" (i.e. fishermen, herdsman).
- Some were scholars such as doctors and rabbis.

Secondly, it was written from different locations.

- Some wrote while incarcerated or on islands of exile.
- Some wrote while on military or evangelistic campaigns.
- Some wrote while wandering in a wilderness or as a fugitive.

Finally, it was written in different languages.

- Some was written in Hebrew.
- Some was written in Greek.
- Some was written in Aramaic.

Still, in spite of these differences, the Bible constitutes a single unit of objective truth (Psa. 119:60 [ASV]; John 17:17); yea, a book that can be understood (cf. 2 Timothy 2:15; 3:15-17) and a book that must be obeyed if we want to go to heaven (James 1:21).

It is the only book of its kind. Its words—praise be unto God—are the words of eternal life (John 6:68).

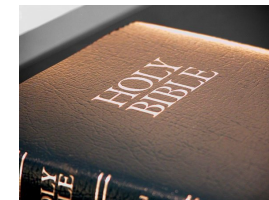

PERSPECTIVE

One of our readers sent us the following article by an unknown author titled "perspective." We thought it was worth sharing.

Imagine you were born in 1900.

On your 14th birthday, World War I starts, and ends on your 18th birthday. 22 million people perish in that war.
