CLCM is fully accredited by the Association of Independent Christian Colleges and Seminaries (AICCS). We have secured this high-level accreditation while keeping our tuition costs affordable.

Accreditation is the act of certifying that an educational institution maintains suitable standards, and approves an institution of learning by an official review board after the school has met specific requirements. Specifically, accreditation is the review of a school's course offerings and procedures by a group of its peers to certify that the school is meeting its stated objectives and offering its students the education it promises them.

It's important to note that AICCS is one of the largest non-governmental academic associations in the world. Since it is not affiliated with the U.S. Department of Education, this ensures that we can maintain biblical norms and standards. Also, government-recognized accreditation is not necessary for religious vocations. If you are studying for something other than ministry, check with the school you will study at, as it may belong to a different accrediting association.

CLC-M credits will transfer to any AICCS-accredited school. We also have credit transfer agreements (CTAs) with other Christian colleges and universities accredited by different organizations (see list below). It is important to note that the receiving institution has the prerogative to determine whether and which credit(s) will transfer. That said, we will do our best to work with other colleges and universities to get the credits you earned at CLC-M to transfer, if you choose to pursue this option.

Religious Exemption Status. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) is the state agency that oversees postsecondary education approvals through the Educational Approval Program (EAP). According to state statute, "Schools of a parochial or denominational character offering courses having a sectarian objective" are exempt from having to obtain approval from DSPS. The EAP does not regulate schools of a parochial or denominational character offering programs having a sectarian objective. For example, a course for bible study would not require EAP approval. CLCM is a religious institution exempt from state regulations and oversight in the Commonwealth of Wisconsin. The DSPS is not an accrediting agency. CLCM is accredited through [AICCS](#).
