

Saturday Night – Cabin Time Guide (Shooting for 20 Minutes-ish)

“Living a Faith That Stands Out”

2 Timothy 2:15, 1 Corinthians 10:23–24, Philippians 2:3, & 1 Timothy 4:12

MAIN IDEA

Following Jesus is more than just believing the right things — it’s living in a way that reflects Him through humility, wisdom, influence, and love for others.

We want to help them:

- Discover what mature Christian living looks like
- Think critically about influence and choices
- Be challenged to represent Jesus well in everyday life

OPENING QUESTION (3 minutes)

- “What makes someone stand out in your school or friend group?”
 - Confidence
 - Talent
 - Popularity
 - Sports
 - Social media presence
 - Personality

Follow-up:

- “What do you think should make a Christian stand out?”

“These verses show us what a real, visible faith looks like.”

READ THE PASSAGES (2 minutes)

Have students take turns reading:

- 2 Timothy 2:15
- 1 Corinthians 10:23–24
- Philippians 2:3
- 1 Timothy 4:12

“Which verse connects most with your life right now?”

DISCUSSION / DISCOVERY QUESTIONS (10 minutes)

1. 2 Timothy 2:15 says to “present yourself to God as one approved.”

What do you think that means?

Some Thoughts:

- Why does studying God’s Word matter?
- What keeps teenagers from taking faith seriously?
- How can someone grow spiritually?

Examples:

- Reading Scripture consistently
- Asking questions
- Learning truth instead of just opinions online

2. In 1 Corinthians 10:23–24, Paul says:

“Not everything is beneficial.”

What are some things that may not be sinful but still pull someone away from God?

- Certain media
- Toxic friendships
- Social media habits
- Pride
- Obsession with popularity

“How do we know if something is helping or hurting our faith?”

3. Philippians 2:3 talks about humility.

Why is humility difficult for people?

Ask:

- What does selfish ambition look like for teenagers?
- What would it look like to put others first?
 - Encouraging instead of competing
 - Listening
 - Serving quietly
 - Including people others ignore

4. 1 Timothy 4:12 says young people can set an example.

Do you think teenagers underestimate their influence?

Ask:

- How can a teenager positively influence others?
- What areas did Paul mention?
 - Speech
 - Conduct
 - Love
 - Faith
 - Purity

CHALLENGE SECTION (3–4 minutes)

“Your faith is not just something you believe privately — it shapes how you live publicly.”

Through the rest of camp and when we return home:

- What is one area where your life needs to reflect Jesus more clearly?
- What is one choice you can make that benefits others instead of just yourself?

Encourage practical responses:

- Spend intentional time in God’s Word
- Change unhealthy habits
- Encourage someone daily
- Watch words and attitudes
- Choose humility over attention

FINAL THOUGHT

“God does not wait until you are older to use you. Right now, your attitude, choices, words, and actions can point people toward Jesus.”

CLOSING PRAYER (1 minute)

Pray that students would:

- Grow spiritually
- Live wisely
- Reflect humility
- Be bold examples of Jesus at school, home, and online

BONUS QUESTION

“If people only watched your actions this week, what would they assume you believe about Jesus?”
