

You will need to use the red Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) hymnals to sing the hymns. Our Sunday morning service is livestreamed on YouTube and your image may appear.

Communion - All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the gift of Holy Communion. Children who haven't received Holy Communion may also come forward for a blessing. You can either kneel or remain standing when you come to the altar. We offer both wheat and gluten-free wafers, and both wine and grape juice. If you would like to receive grape juice, please take a glass from the tray that has already been filled when you come forward. If you would like to receive a gluten-free wafer, please let the Pastor know when you are given the bread.

Children are always welcome! Please feel free to walk around in the rear area of our worship space if your child becomes restless. Rest rooms (with diaper decks) are located in the hallway to the right of the entryway. You can find cloth bags containing activities for children aged 3 and older in the back of our worship space. We ask you to please return the cloth bags and their contents (minus any artwork your child creates while you are worshipping) at the end of today's service.

HOLY GOSPEL: JOHN 3:1-17

Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him." Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again." "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!" Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked. "You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him." For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.



THANK YOU – THANK YOU – THANK YOU ... to everyone who has been contributing to the success of our Little Pantry. We're so grateful to all who continue to donate. The food in the pantry goes quickly. We have been attempting to replenish the pantry daily.



As food insecurity continues, variety is important in choosing the items that people can find in the Little Pantry. We are asking you to focus on cereal and other breakfast items, complete pancake mixes (made with water), syrup, peanut butter, jelly, soup, tuna & other canned meats, fruit (canned or in individual packs), lunchbox foods and baby food. Please remember, when you bring your donations to the church, you can put your items directly into the Little Pantry or leave them in the grocery cart in our entryway.

You can also support the Little Pantry with a cash donation that's clearly marked, "Little Pantry."

NOTE: We recently learned that we need to have special permits from the State and Health Department if we want to put any type of fresh food (fruit, veggies, eggs, potatoes, etc.) into the pantry. Your generous gifts of canned and boxed items continue to change the lives of individuals and families in our community. Thank you!

Please remember that our Little Pantry may provide the only food a family has to meet its needs — protein is very important.

Please continue to support this ministry, knowing that your generosity will help families right here in the Plum & Murrysville area.

PLEASE CONSIDER DONATING TO HEIFER INTERNATIONAL DURING LENT

Heifer is a non-profit organization in its 82nd year whose mission is to end hunger and poverty in a sustainable way while caring for the Earth. They are currently in 19 countries, including the United States, and in four continents.

Since Dan West started the program in 1944 after working with refugees of the Spanish Civil War, 59.8 million households have been helped. In 2025 Heifer helped 1.4 million households.

Heifer's program is not just a handout. They support and invest in local, small-scale farmers and in their communities to end food insecurity. People are taught to become self-reliant and



to make living incomes. Heifer starts with a seed investment of livestock or agriculture and mentors farmers to build businesses, then to gain access to markets. About 2/3 of the participants are women who reinvest up to 90% of their incomes back into their families. In 2025 total sales were \$51 million. Some of the profits can be used to build schools to educate their children and to buy medicine.

Heifer has 12 cornerstones including Passing the Gift in which at least one animal or assets must be passed along to other families. Knowledge and training are also passed along so the recipient becomes the donor.

Spirituality is another cornerstone in which the love of Jesus is shared by serving others.

Charity Navigator rated Heifer 4 of 4 stars with a 98% rating.

Last year our church donated \$1,217 which was DOUBLED by businesses and individuals supporting Heifer. And our donation will be MATCHED again this year. We've given \$41,807 since 1992.

You can make a tax-deductible donation by writing a check to Christ's Lutheran and writing "Heifer" on the memo line or by using our church's website or app.

Thank you for continuing to bring your plastic bags for recycling. We are currently collecting bags to benefit Trinity on the Northside.

Starting in 2026, Trex has changed their recycling challenge:

NexTrex Recycling Challenge



How does the challenge work?

Bring your bags to church and place them in the bins labeled for plastic bag recycling. The bags will be weighed and taken to a recycling drop-off site.

- 25 participating organizations are randomly selected each quarter and rewarded with a gift, valued at \$500
- Each 250 pounds is an entry into the drawing

What does Trex provide?

- Up to three recycling bins
- Posters
- Each participating organization receives a gift from Trex when they reach the first 250 pounds (annually), valued at \$100


