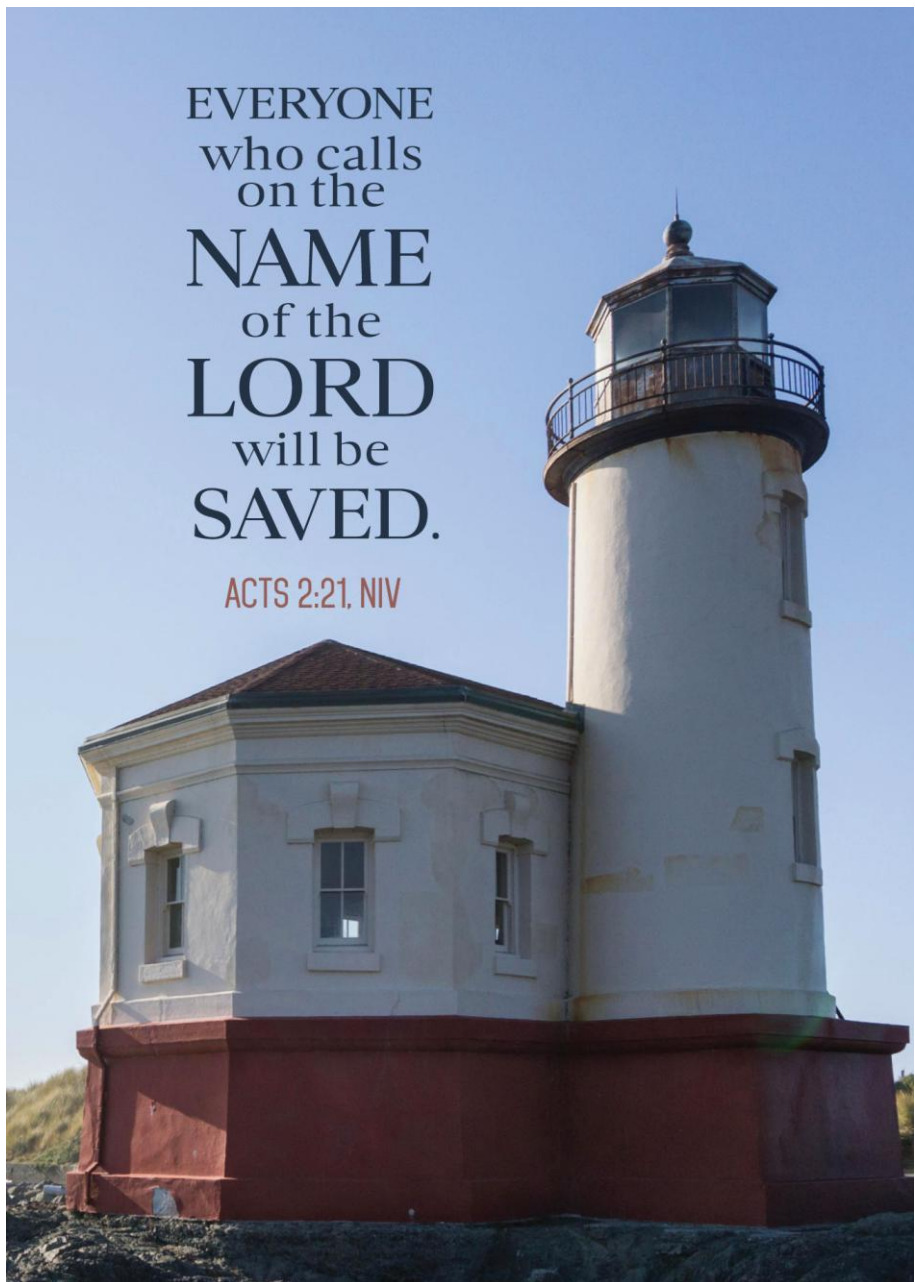

Christ's Lutheran Church is a Christ-centered and welcoming, Christian community committed to encouraging faith-filled living, deepening friendships, and life-changing discipleship.

Welcome! If you are new to worship in a Lutheran church, this introduction will help guide you through our worship service. The prayers, responses, and service music are printed in this bulletin. You will need to use the red Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) hymnals to sing the hymns. Our Sunday morning service is livestreamed on YouTube and your image may appear.

Communion - All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the gift of Holy Communion. Children who haven't received Holy Communion may also come forward for a blessing. You can either kneel or remain standing when you come to the altar. We offer both wheat and gluten-free wafers, and both wine and grape juice. If you would like to receive grape juice, please take a glass from the tray that has already been filled when you come forward. If you would like to receive a gluten-free wafer, please let the Pastor know when you are given the bread.

Children are always welcome! Please feel free to walk around in the rear area of our worship space if your child becomes restless. Rest rooms (with diaper decks) are located in the hallway to the right of the entryway. You can find cloth bags containing activities for children aged 3 and older in the back of our worship space. We ask you to please return the cloth bags and their contents (minus any artwork your child creates while you are worshiping) at the end of today's service.

SECOND READING: ACTS 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language?"

Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome,

both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.” All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.” But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, Fellow Jews and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ‘In the last days it will be, God declares that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord’s great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.’ ”



**Plastic that can be recycled:** Grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper bags, plastic shipping envelopes, Ziploc & other resealable food storage bags, cereal bags, case overwrap, ice bags, salt bags, pallet wrap & stretch film, wood pellet bags, produce bags. **All plastic must be clean, dry and free of food residue.**

**Things that cannot be recycled:** Frozen food bags, hot dog or meat wrap packaging, candy bar wrappers, pet food bags, plastic tablecloths, PPE items, shiny & crinkly film like floral wrap, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging, hard or soft plastic containers.

You can help by depositing tabs you collect in the container in the church Entryway.

If you are you over age 70 1/2, you can withdraw funds federally tax free from retirement accounts, such as IRAs, through a Qualified Charitable Distribution.

Contributions made through QCDs are an available vehicle to support Christ's Lutheran Church's mission while reducing personal income subject to federal taxes.

The withdrawal is made payable directly to the charity by the IRA custodian and counts toward any federal annual Required Minimum Distribution(RMD). Talk with your financial planner to learn more.

### **Receive Important CLC Information on Your Smart Phone**

Scan the QR code or search your app store for Christ's Lutheran (ELCA) to download the CLC app to your phone. Set up your profile, then follow the steps below.



*Even if you previously downloaded our app and created your profile, there are a few things to be done in order to receive our notifications:*

- ~ Open the app and click on your initials in the circle on the top right to go to the settings for the CLC app. Check your Profile to make sure your mobile phone number is correct.
- ~ Go back to the settings, scroll down to App Settings and click on Notifications. Make sure Notifications in the CLC app is set to ON (the button should be slid to the right).

When you receive a notification from CLC, it will pop up briefly on your screen then download to where your unread texts, social media messages, etc. are stored until you read them. You'll also see the church



icon in the notifications bar on your phone screen. Tap or swipe your notifications bar to read what we've sent.

Messages from CLC are not texts and the message won't appear in the app you use to send/receive texts.
