3. **Read Psalm 19:1-4.** What stands out to you most about these verses?

For you, what parts of creation most point to a Creator God?

4. What do you think about the idea that "the deeper we go into science, the more it can point to something beyond itself"?

Was there an example from the sermon (or your own thinking) that illustrates the above statement?

5. What benefit of science stood out to you most? (caring for people, caring for creation, deepening awe and worship)

How have you seen science used in a positive way in your own life or work?

6. **Read Psalm 103:11-12.** What stands out to you about how God describes his love and forgiveness? How does connecting the vastness of the universe to the vastness of God's love impact the way you think about Him?
