

Charlotte's mobility is limited, but her spirit is strong. She spends much time in her recliner chair today. She spends days doing crossword puzzles and other workbooks, and enjoys TV game shows. She was an excellent cook, and desserts were treasured at family reunions. Most of her cooking today is via use of the microwave oven. Some of her favorite foods are salads, chicken, Cheerios, and no sugar desserts – particularly Sugar Free Krunchy Klondike Bars (one a day).

Charlotte's father passed away when she was an infant, and she has no recollection of him (but will see him in heaven in Ron's opinion). CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Dinner: We start off the evenings giving the students a chance

to hang out and expend some energy before we gather for supper. Dinner was spaghetti and meatballs with a salad.

Activity: The evening's lesson was about "Empathy". For the activity, students were given the opportunity to practice "Active Listening". A student was randomly selected to read a news article out loud. Two other students were randomly selected to make as much noise as possible. The rest of the students needed to try to listen and pay attention to the student reading the news article so that they could answer questions at the end of the activity about the news article. Some debrief questions of the activity:

- For the reader: How did it feel trying to read the information while there was a loud side conversation happening?
- For the audience: How hard was it to hear the details and focus on the story?

For the noise makers: How much of the story did you hear?

Lesson: The lesson started with a quick explanation of Lent and the goal of removing things that distract us from God. We then moved into empathy. Some key points were:

- We develop and practice empathy with others to make connections (Rom 12:15)
- Our relationship with Jesus will help us form relationships and connections with those around us

We are not meant to be alone

Next Steps: Students were encouraged to practice active listening and share experiences with others at home. An example given was to ask your parents what makes them happy and point out how happy they sound when they talk about it. Parents can incorporate and cultivate active listening skills with their children during one-on-one time or during dinner time conversations.
