From the Pastors Desk:

Diving Deep



As I sit here and write this month’s article, it is cold, foggy, and just ick, so it got me thinking about pools. The promise of a pool is clear, refreshing, and cool—revitalizing on a hot day. When my children were small, we would go to the “kiddie” pool and play in the shallow water. While it was an opportunity to “get wet,” I couldn’t help but think of the difference between standing in a few inches of water and actually jumping into the deep end. The kiddie pool is safe. It’s comfortable. But it isn’t the same as swimming.

In many ways, faith can become like that shallow pool.

In Revelation 3:20, Jesus declares a staggering truth. In the letter to the church at Laodicea, He takes notice that the church has become apathetic in their faith. They gather and do the activity of faith, but relational passion is absent. They are people of worldly means who have few pressing needs. Life is manageable on their own, yet they still maintain the habits of religion.

What is striking is that Jesus does not accuse them of open rebellion. They are not spreading false teaching. They are not living in blatant disobedience. They simply are not engaged.

They gather for worship, sing, pray, and hear the words of Christ from the apostles’ letters, and they think themselves satisfied. Yet Jesus says something remarkable: “Behold, I stand at the door and knock.” The One whom they worship is standing outside, waiting to be welcomed in.

“Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.”

It is possible to practice faith without experiencing its depth.

Consecration is what moves us from being satisfied with the shallowness of our faith to seeking something deeper—something more—a relationship that upends everything. Consecration is the decision to step out of the kiddie pool and into the deeper waters of life with Christ.

Jesus stands and knocks at the door, wanting to enter our worship, our prayers, our devotion, and our daily moments in order to transform them. He does not want mere attendance in our religious lives; He desires communion.

Author Jentezen Franklin writes:

“There are dimensions of our glorious King that will never be revealed to the casual, disinterested worshiper. There are walls of intercession that will never be scaled by dispassionate religious service. But when you take steps to break out of the ordinary and worship Him as He deserves, you will begin to see facets of His being you never knew existed. He will begin to share secrets about Himself, His plans, His desires for you. When you worship God as He deserves, He is magnified.”

The invitation of Christ has always been an invitation into depth. It is an invitation to open the door, to welcome Him fully into our lives, and to allow Him to transform us from the inside out.

So perhaps the question for all of us this month is simple:

Are we content standing in the shallow water, or are we ready to dive deeper into life with Christ?



Theology Matters: Public Christianity

March has come, and as I write this, I'm thinking about Daylight Savings Time, which comes this weekend. As the light has grown day by day, I have been paying attention to my drive home in the evening. Each day, I've noticed that it's later that I must turn on my headlights on. It is a blessing that we can trust what is written in Genesis about creation:

And God said, "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth." And it was so. – Genesis 1:14-15, NRSV

Our God gave us a wonderful universe and planet to call home. As you see the light growing each day, give thanks to Jesus, the Light of the World, in whom there is no darkness at all.

This month, I want to move to our second bullet point of Methodist distinctives:

The Christian faith is not private and must be lived out practically.

While personal devotion is an important part of our faith, Christianity is not primarily a private matter. Many people make the statement that their religion is a private thing, and it should not be an overt part of living, but both Scripture and our Methodist faith completely disagree with that notion. Our faith in Christ is not a private matter, and it should impact every aspect of our lives.

We begin with the case from the Bible. Peter writes in his first epistle:

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and respect. – 3:13-16a, NRSV

In this passage, Peter is talking about good outward actions. He begins in verse 9, "Do not repay evil for evil or abuse for abuse, but, on the contrary, repay with a blessing." This is public action. Then, when people question you, it is to be a vocal and open response which tells the world that you act because of "the hope that is in you." This is not private devotion behind a closed door. This is public witness to Christ's Kingdom in what you do and what you say

Secondly, our faith is not simply a "worship thing" that we do on Sunday morning. It is a worldview which changes the way we live and make decisions. In Romans, Paul tells believers, "Do not be conformed to this age," which tells us that we should look completely different than the secular sphere. But there is a purpose for that refusal to conform. He completes the thought, "but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." We are to be transformed so that we can understand how God wants us to live differently.

Theology Matters: Public Christianity continued

This means that we both speak our faith into the public square and we purposefully live differently than the world. We live God's ethics and values, and they should put us at odds with the culture. Our witness should display the Kingdom of God and its values, and this is a very public, even political idea. And here's what may be a disturbing thought, God's politics are neither the Republican Party line nor the Democratic Party line. They are God's line for a political sphere that transcends our citizenship in the United States of America. Paul writes, "But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Philippians 3:20, NRSV).

Our Methodist Christianity takes this very seriously, and that came directly from John Wesley. Wesley spent his life speaking out against social and political evils, especially about drunkenness, poverty, slavery, and political freedom. He wrote of slavery, "I strike at the root of this complicated villainy: I absolutely deny all slave-holding to be consistent with any degree of natural justice."

But Wesley did not simply speak out about evil. He also worked against it. He consistently taught the need to give generously to the poor, and his Methodist Societies were known for this. He wrote, "Earn all you can; save all you can; give all you can," and he practiced what he preached. He died without a penny to his name, having given all his money away, and he lobbied the government tirelessly for abolition of slavery and improved treatment for the poor, downtrodden, and helpless.


Methodism means that we speak the truth of our faith, speak out against the evil which the world embraces, and we work practically to change the culture and governmental systems which mistreat, abuse, and harm people. This is in line with the Biblical summary of what our faith is about. The prophet Micah says it this way, "He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8, NRSV). And if you prefer a New Testament reference, James writes, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself unstained by the world" (James 1:27).

Our faith is not a private matter of devotion. It is absolutely an impetus to public action and speech. That comes from Scripture and our Methodist accent. May you bring our faith to bear in this way everywhere.



The images show the proposed renovation and addition work for Grace Church. The darkened gray area is our new lobby with a covered opening for drop off and pick up. This will also include the repair and recoating of our parking lot.



We are now working with the contractor to secure solid bid numbers for the construction work. This new area will be a large, welcoming space for our church family, where we can mingle between services and greet one another well on Sunday morning. We will have a new location for the Welcome Desk and for an expanded coffee bar. The port-cochere will enable people to be dropped off at the door, under cover, and we will have new ADA compliant parking spaces to the left of the entrance, right in front of the building.

In the drawing here, you can see what the outside of the new building will look like, and we are all very excited to see this project move forward to construction in the coming months. 





Written, arranged, and orchestrated by Mark Hayes, "The Power of the Cross" shows us how we find redemption from sin through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. It combines songs you may already know, like "Hosanna", "Lamb of God" and "Crown Him With Many Crowns", with newer songs, like "Come to the Table", "Trust in the Lord" and "The Power of the Cross", to give all of us a prism through which we view the unfolding events of Holy Week - the cheers that fill Jerusalem on Palm Sunday that soon turn to jeers, the Lord's Supper that Jesus shares with his faithful disciples (including the one who will betray him), Jesus' spiritual struggle at Gethsemane where he he ultimately surrenders to God's purpose for him, the anguish of his mother Mary as she witnesses Him hanging on the cross, and the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior on Easter morning.

The Chancel Choir will be joined by a 14-piece professional orchestra to add to the beauty and meaning of our message on March 29, and we hope you will also join us at the 11:00 service on that day to experience "The Power of the Cross"!




