Lord and Savior are terms we use often in a generalized sense. The church can be guilty of leaning to heavily on insider language and titles without the command of understanding. There are many Christians unable to articulate what these two terms mean through scripture, let alone what it means from the cosmic scale funneled down to its intimate and most personal applications. The ability to speak about our faith is critical, especially in the current times and culture we are living in. 1 Ptr 3:15 tells us that we are to have the Truth of God firmly in our hearts and that we are to always be ready to give an answer to the faith born within us. This is a command of Scripture, therefore a command of God.

There are two understandings of LORD and Lord used within the Bible. LORD in all capital letters references God as the *creation demiurge* or the Ultimate Creator of all things. In Hebrew it is Tetragrammaton using only four letters *JHVH* or *YHWH*. Jehovah and Yahweh. It reminds me of a humor I heard once, Jesus was sitting on the mount where he was giving his most famous discourse and said "I am the Son of God" the people sitting to hear this were amazed and said "NO WAY!" and Jesus said "Yahweh!". Yahweh is LORD of all

creation and the supreme divinity that has eternally existed. John's Gospel tells us in Chapter one "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God". John the Evangelist is referring to Jesus being the *logos* or the living Word of God. The incarnate flesh of Christ being God in the world.

When we see the term Lord in the Bible it is referring is a human authority. Jesus is often referred to as Rabbi or Lord in scripture and this often conveys the human misunderstandings of not only who Jesus is on earth but his divine origin initially. Lordship, is a level of authority but ultimate authority. It was Pilot who claimed Jesus didn't have any authority because Pilot himself was the local authority. Jesus gives the famous statement "You would not have authority if it was not given to you". This is a slap in the face to Pilot if Pilot understood who Jesus was. Pilot had some authority, but Jesus is THE AUTHORITY.

Jesus is not one God among many. He IS THE TRUTH, The WAY, and THE LIFE. LORD of all creation and at his name every knee will bow and every tongue confess Jesus Christ is LORD. The world needs Jesus and we are commissioned as the church to share the message and power of the Living God and His work in Jesus Christ to the world. Matthew 28:19-20, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you..." We are as the church to be ready and to share what the Lordship of Jesus Christ means and how his salvific act matters to our lives and our future, and its impact to the world.

Lent is a great opportunity to look to the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead as we walk the journey of Christ in his last weeks leading up to this historical moment at Golgotha. As your pastor it is my hope that you will take advantage of the small group teaching opportunities held at Grace Church and be consistently in worship as we gather and learn more about this epic of Jesus, so that we may be filled with knowledge and understanding in our faith.

Russell is 95 years old at this time. He was involved in Boy Scouts and Sunday School as a young boy and later as a scout leader and teacher of Sunday School.

Earl Frock was a mentor to Russell in many aspects of his Grace life. He took Russell "to the altar" and helped him in his journey to find out more about his life as a Christian.

Russell and his wife helped with the early team of church members to pick out this "shining spot on the hill" that we all know as Grace United Methodist Church. He was on the Consistory Committee that is now the church Council.

As a young man, Russell served in the Navy on the U.S.S—Cascade. During his tour of duty, Russell went ashore and saw the devastation following the bombing of "Hiroshima Japan. This experience stayed with him forever leading him to enjoy his home and not traveling very much. Russell told us once you're in Japan, "you never want to eat rice or fish again!"



In 1949 Russell married Janet Albright—who he had known since she was 9 years old. There fathers were friends and buddies in the same stamp club.

Janet and Russell settled in the Hanover-New Oxford area. He attended college and became an accountant. His hobbies include woodworking and landscaping his lawn. All of his family have benefited from his expert woodworking skills such as furniture building, trunks for the children and many other beautiful hand crafted pieces.

What is Discipleship?

THAT is what it really means to be a Christian, a follower, a disciple of Jesus of Nazareth.
