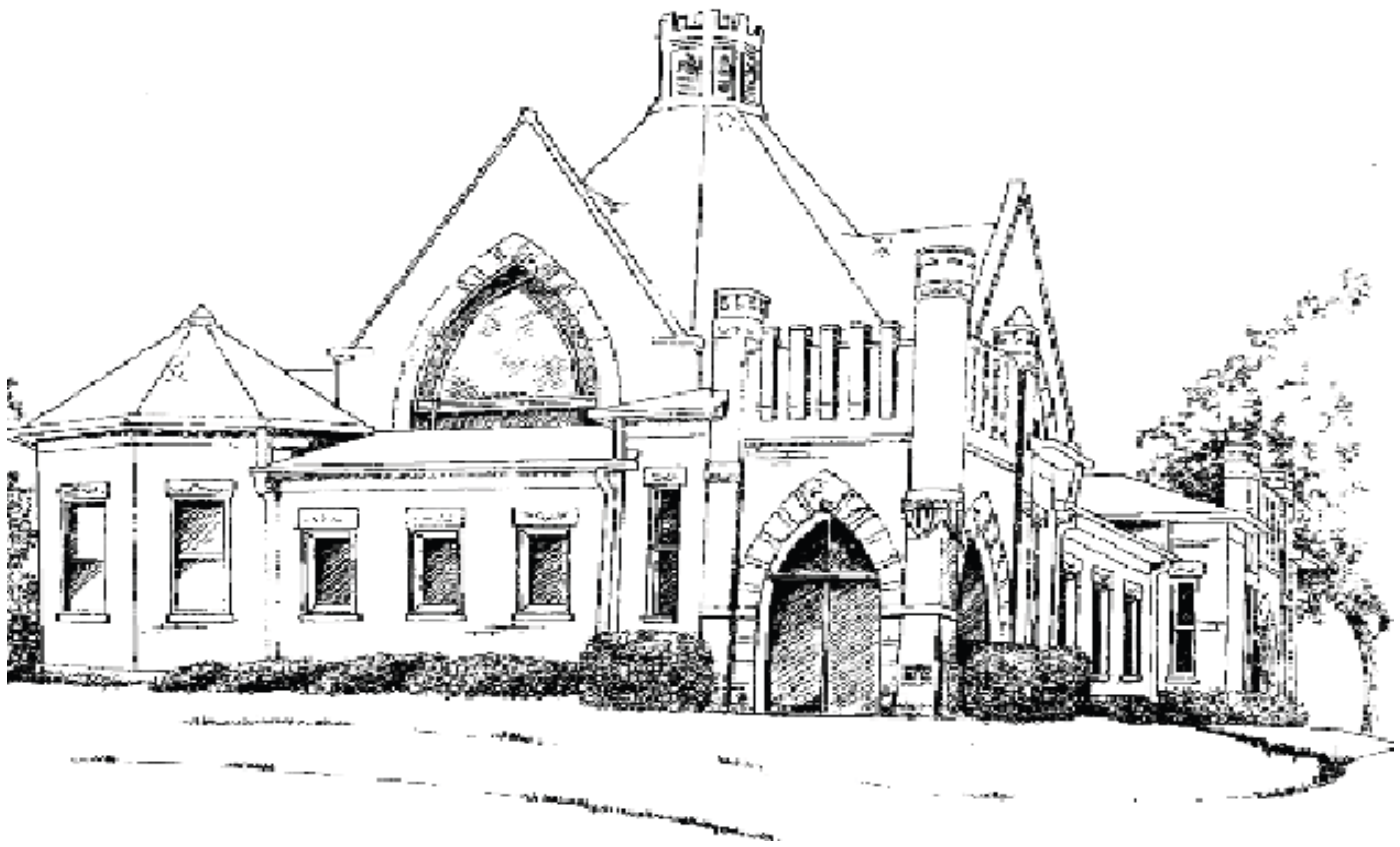

ECCLESIASTES 5:1-7
