Kingdom of God Reflection Questions 04/19/2026

1. A definition of the kingdom of God is “God’s active reign through Jesus, breaking into our world to restore all things according to His original design.” What part of that definition stands out most to you?
2. The sermon uses the illustration of higher dimensions to show that what is impossible for us in our dimensions is effortless for God in His dimensions. How should that reshape the way we think about miracles, healing, and impossible situations?
3. The message says the kingdom of God is presence-based, not rule-based. What is the difference between living by religious rules and living in the presence of the King?
4. What are some examples of church culture that can become familiar and comfortable, but are not the same thing as kingdom culture?
5. The book of Ephesians begins with “Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, to the saints in Ephesus, the faithful in Christ Jesus.” The verse is revealing to us two different locations for believers. One is geographical and the other is spiritual. Why is this significant?
6. The woman was in a crowd, but Jesus distinguished her touch from everyone else. What is the difference between crowding around Jesus and truly reaching for Him in faith?
7. Jesus called the healed woman “Daughter.” What does that reveal about the kingdom of God as more than just solving problems, but restoring identity and wholeness?
8. Hannah’s prayer came out of years of pain, provocation, and barrenness. What does her life teach us about how God can use long seasons of pain to produce deep breakthrough hunger and prayer?
9. Matthew 6:11 can literally be translated, “Give us today the bread of tomorrow.” Although Jesus is referring to daily needs, how does this wording hint to a foretaste of the future breaking into the present?
10. What part of the sermon stood out to you most and why?
