3. What stood out to you most about the “two babies in the womb” analogy?
4. What are some “limitations” of this life that might point to the fact that we are headed to a greater eternal reality?
5. How could thinking of this life as “preparation” change your perspective on daily living?
6. Why do you think nothing in this world fully satisfies us? How can our dissatisfaction actually point us toward God?
7. What is the difference between knowing about God (oida) and knowing God personally (ginosko)? Which Greek word does Paul use in Phil 3:10 when he says, “I want to know Christ”?
8. What are some signs of a genuine relationship with God?
9. Why does Jesus emphasize “I never knew you” rather than pointing to a lack of religious activity?
10. What are some ways people substitute religious activity for real relationship?
11. What did the examples in Matthew 7:21-23, Matthew 15:1-8, Matthew 25:1-12) teach about what God is truly looking for?
12. In the Fiddler on the Roof illustration, why does the wife respond with actions instead of answering the question, “Do you love me?”
13. What are some ways we can confuse faithfulness, discipline, or activity with genuine love for God?
