

Sermon Questions: Jesus' Resurrection Dialogue 4/09/2023

- 1. What did the resurrected Jesus with two of his disciples, after finding them walking along the road, struggling with disappointment and unbelief?
- 2. Jesus asked the two disciples several questions. Were you aware that Jesus asks over 100 questions, as recorded in the gospels? Did any of the for types of questions have special meaning to you (Direct, Open, Ownership, Revealing)?
- 3. How does the statement, "Some breakthroughs only come on the other side of a powerful question," relate to Matthew 16 when Jesus asks the disciples, "Who do people say that I am?"
- 4. What did you think of the statement, "Disciples are not made through monologues. Disciples are made through dialogues."
- 5. How much of your spiritual development in your church background has been through monologue? How much has been through dialogue? If these were parts were reversed, what difference might that have made regarding where you are today?
- 6. What did you think of the statement, "The opposite of depression is not happiness. The opposite of depression is purpose"? Do you feel like you have clarity of purpose in your own life?
- 7. Has anyone modeled the heart of God to you in the questions they asked you, including the way in which they asked them?
- 8. Can you think of a time in your life when you did not sense the Lord with you while going through a challenging season, but afterwards realized He was with you all along?
- 9. What does the resurrection of Jesus practically mean for your life today?
