Abraham Reflection Questions 06/14/2026

1. Abraham received great promises from God, but the sermon says he is remembered because he fulfilled them. What is the difference between receiving a promise and living in pursuit of it?
2. Genesis 12:1 required Abram to leave his country, family, and father's house. What might God ask someone to "leave" today in order to follow Him fully?
3. Terah started toward Canaan but stopped in Haran. What are some ways people begin in obedience but stop halfway?
4. The sermon mentioned that one of man's inherent weakness is to look for excuses. What are some common excuses Christians use for not doing what God has clearly called them to do?
5. Abraham was seventy-five when he departed from Haran. How can age, physical limitations, lack of gifting, or personal weaknesses become obstacles to obedience?
6. Sarah's barrenness was a major obstacle to the promise of descendants. What do we do when God's promise seems impossible because of our circumstances?
7. Abraham "kept trying." When is perseverance an act of faith, and when can it drift into striving in the flesh?
8. Abraham first looked to Sarah as the way the promise would come. Why is it important to keep coming back to God's original promise and plan?
9. Abraham suggested Eliezer as his heir in Genesis 15. Have you ever tried to "help" God's promise make sense by creating a reasonable backup plan?
10. Genesis 18 shows God returning the promise specifically to Sarah. What does this teach us about God's faithfulness to His word?
11. Abraham's story includes faith, mistakes, delays, and recovery. How does that encourage you in your own walk with God?
