Galatians 4 “Right Time” Reflection Questions 06/21/2026

1. Have you ever experienced a situation where God’s timing felt wrong at first, but later made more sense?
2. Galatians 4:4 says, “But when the right time came, God sent His Son.” What does this verse teach us about God’s view of timing?
3. In Joshua 3, God told Israel to cross the Jordan during flood season. Why might God choose a moment that seems so unreasonable by human standards?
4. In John 11, Mary says to Jesus, “Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died.” What does her question reveal about disappointed faith?
5. Jesus delayed coming to Lazarus, not because He lacked love for them, but because He intended to reveal something greater.
How does that challenge the way we interpret delays?
6. The message says, “When God’s timing feels wrong, it may be because He is doing something deeper than we can see.”
Have you ever seen that to be true in your own life?
7. Why did the birth of Jesus appear to be the wrong time politically in the Roman Empire?
8. Caesar Augustus was called things like “savior,” “bringer of peace,” and “good news.” Why was the announcement of Jesus as Lord and Savior so confrontational in that world?
9. Jesus did not fit many Jewish expectations of what the Messiah would do. How can our expectations of what God should do cause us to miss what He is actually doing?
10. For Mary and Joseph, the timing of Jesus’ birth was personally inconvenient and messy. What does this teach us about how God works in ordinary human difficulty?
11. The sermon says, “Perhaps our worst time is God’s best time.”
What does that mean, and where can that be hard for us to believe?
