Galatians Abraham Reflection Questions 07/19/2026

1. Psalm 84:5 describes people whose hearts are “set on pilgrimage.” What does it look like to approach life as a pilgrimage with God?
2. Micah 6:8 tells us to “walk humbly” with God. Why do you think Scripture describes our relationship with God as a walk?
3. Hebrews 12:1–2 tells us to fix our eyes on Jesus rather than merely on the finish line. How does that change the way we approach our goals?
4. What is the “arrival fallacy,” and when have you been tempted to believe it?
5. Can you remember accomplishing something you had greatly anticipated, only to discover that the satisfaction did not last?
6. Of the four potential idols—money, power, pleasure, and fame—which one do you think most easily competes for your heart?
7. Why is trying to earn love—from our parents, spouse, friends, or God—so spiritually and emotionally damaging?
8. Why does lasting satisfaction often require struggle, sacrifice, or perseverance? What difficult experience has God used in your life to form your character or deepen your faith?
9. How does knowing God help us answer these three questions: Why do things happen? Why am I doing what I am doing? Why does my life matter?
10. Solomon possessed money, power, pleasure, recognition, and success. What did he discover about their ability to satisfy the human heart? (Ecclesiastes 2:10–11)
11. How does the creation illustration of grass connected to soil and fish connected to water help explain humanity’s need for God?
12. What is the significance of God telling Abraham, “I am your very great reward”? (Genesis 15:1)
