Psalm 91 Reflection Questions 08/02/2026

1. Psalm 91 begins with the person who “dwells” in God’s presence. What is the difference between visiting God during trouble and making God your dwelling place?
2. Which practices—prayer, Scripture, worship, remembering God’s faithfulness, or fellowship—most help you cultivate the “secret place” with God?
3. Why is it important to build a life with God during ordinary days rather than waiting until an emergency comes?
4. How can speaking God’s Word strengthen faith without turning our words into a mechanical formula?
5. Have you ever experienced a season in which prayer or making Biblical declarations felt like pushing a heavy stone uphill? What helped you continue praying or declaring?
6. When comparing the phrases “and it came to pass” vs “and it came to stay,” how does the Biblical language of walking through valleys and seasons of trouble give us hope?
7. What is the difference between acknowledging fear and surrendering to fear?
8. In what situations might wisdom be one of the ways that genuine faith expresses itself?
9. Psalm 91 moves from sheltering under God’s wings to trampling upon lions and serpents. How does time in God’s presence prepare us to confront what once terrified us?
10. Why is it significant that God’s promises are rooted in relationship (“because he loves Me...because he knows My name”), rather than flawless performance or perfect faith?
11. How does Jesus’ affirmation of His imperfect disciples in John 16:27 encourage someone who genuinely loves Christ but feels disqualified by past failures?
