Parable of the Three Servants Reflection Questions 09/06/2026

1. What does it mean to be a steward rather than an owner of what God has given us?
2. How might viewing everything we have as entrusted by God change the way we live?
3. Which area of stewardship—time, spiritual gifts, opportunities, relationships, influence, resources, or experience—do you most need to reconsider?
4. What does it mean that the master give the servants different amounts “according to their ability”?
5. How can comparing our assignment with someone else’s keep us from being faithful to our own?
6. In Matthew 25:21, what does the parable teach us about how faithfulness can enlarge our capacity for future responsibility?
7. Do you think the third servant’s description of the master was completely accurate? Why or why not?
8. Why should we be careful about assuming that every authority figure in a parable is a 100% complete portrait of God?
9. What are some distorted views of God that can cause people to live fearfully or passively?
10. What does the statement “Fear buries what faith would put to work” mean to you?
11. Which excuse is most likely to hold you back: “I might fail,” “Someone else could do it better,” “What I have is too small,” or “I will begin when conditions are better”?
12. What do Moses’ staff, David’s sling, the widow’s oil, and the boy’s lunch teach us about what God can do with ordinary things?
13. What has God already placed in your hands that you may be overlooking or undervaluing?
14. Is there something you have buried because of fear, disappointment, comparison, or past failure?
15. What is one specific step you can take this week to faithfully use what God has entrusted to you?
