1. What part of the vision in Ezekiel 37 of the valley of dry bones stood out to you most, and why?
2. Why did God lead Ezekiel back and forth among the bones instead of allowing him to rush past the condition of them?
3. What “dry places” in our lives are we sometimes reluctant to face honestly?
4. Discuss this quote: “Naming the condition of something is not the same as surrendering to it.” What is the difference between facing reality and surrendering to hopelessness?
5. What does it mean practically to stop merely talking about the valley and begin speaking God’s truth into it?
6. We often want God to show us that something is beginning to improve before we act in faith. Why is this approach generally not effective?
7. What does the statement “Structure is not the same thing as life” mean for us personally and for the church?
8. Where might we have good organization, sound doctrine, excellent programs, or polished worship but still need the breath of God?
9. What does Ezekiel 37 reveal about the relationship between the Word of God and the Spirit of God in bringing restoration and life?
10. As a spirit-filled church, how can we distinguish excitement, energy, or heightened emotion from genuine spiritual life?
11. How does God’s explanation of the vision in Ezekiel 37:11 reveal that the deepest problem facing Israel was not merely their circumstances, but their loss of hope?
12. Is there an area of your life where you feel forgotten or believe that your hope is gone? How does Ezekiel 37 challenge the voice you have allowed to have the final word?
13. What would it look like for God to “breathe again” into a hopeless area of your life?
