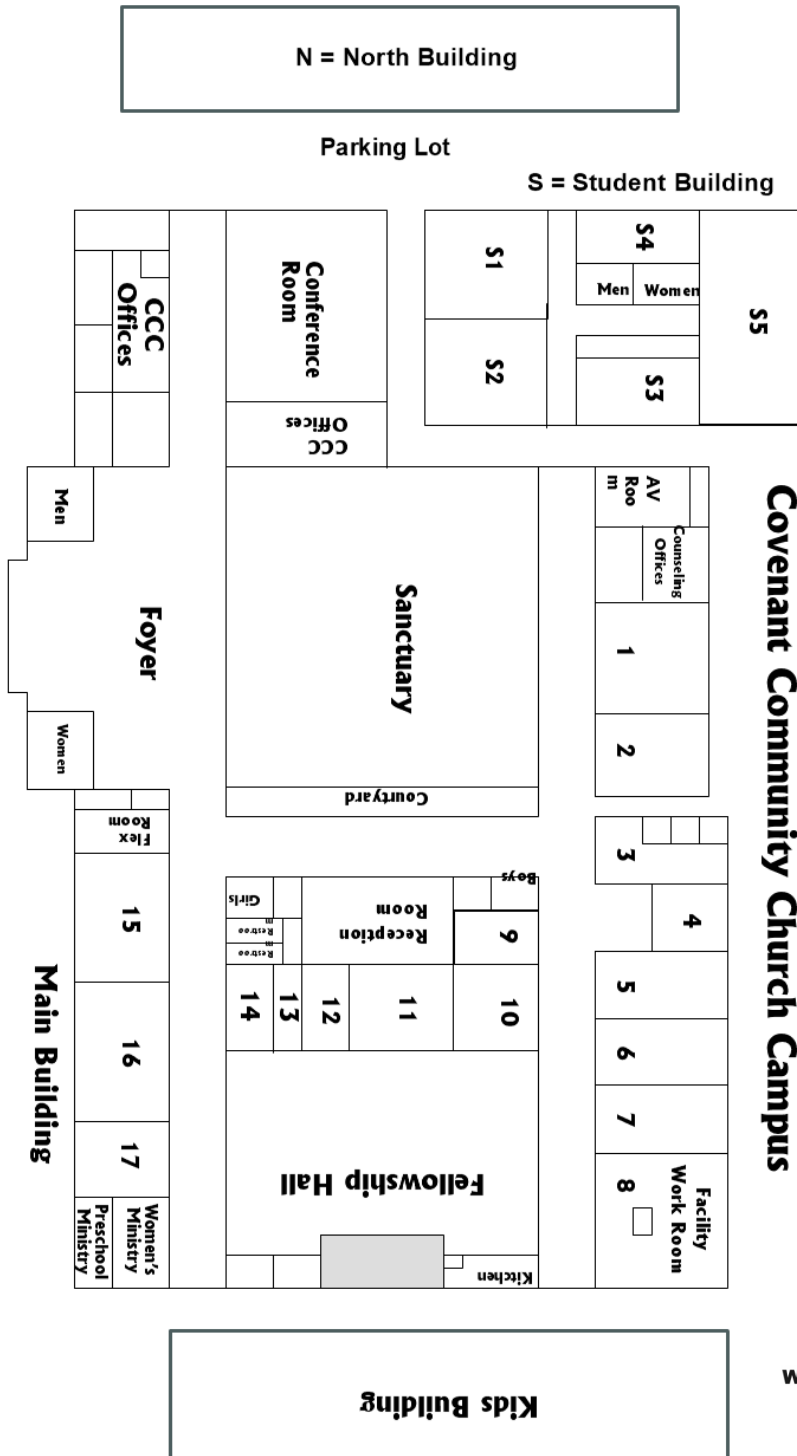
ENJOY (WOMEN) - ROOM 11 - DANETTE SHARP
