Jonah 4

A little bit of context :

Jonah was called and given a message to share with Nineveh (the Assyrians); he had a divine purpose. That which he fled from due to his own personal opinion of God's plan.

Jonah prophesied during the reign of Jeroboam II (793-753 BC) in the Northern Kingdom. He was one of 3 prophets during this time-period, the others being Hosea and Amos.

The Assyrians were the predominant force oppressing Israel up to this period. There is then a shift of focus internally as the leadership structure and civil unrest threaten to tear apart the nation.

This results in their decline and ability for Israel to expand its borders.

Jonah 4 has 3 sections that we'll study this morning, and those are:

God hears him (v. 1-4) – Jonah lodges his complaints

God comforts him (v. 5-8) – Comfort in misery

God teaches him (v. 9-11) – Do you see what I see?
