1. What stands out to you most about Nebuchadnezzar's dream and its interpretation?
2. Why do you think God revealed the rise and fall of earthly kingdoms in advance?
3. What does the statue made of different materials teach us about human power and governments?
4. According to Daniel 2:44–45, what makes God's Kingdom different from every earthly kingdom?
5. Revelation 17:14 calls Jesus "Lord of lords and King of kings." What does that title mean personally to you?

Key Truth

Human kingdoms are temporary and fragile, but the Kingdom of Jesus is eternal and unstoppable.

1. Where do people today tend to place their hope or security besides God?
2. Have you ever experienced disappointment from trusting too much in something temporary (success, politics, money, relationships, etc.)?

2. What situation in your life needs more prayer instead of worry or control?
3. How can you intentionally remind yourself that Jesus is the true King over every area of your life?
