**Romans 11:25–36**

**Theme:** *Israel Will Be Saved — God Will Be Glorified*



### Warm Up

**Read Romans 11:25–32 together.**

1. What words or phrases stand out to you in this passage?
2. Why do you think Paul says he does not want believers to be “ignorant of this mystery”?



### Know It

#### **PART 1: ISRAEL WILL BE SAVED**

**Read Romans 11:25–32 again.**

#### **Discuss:**

1. What does Paul mean by:
  - “Partial hardening”?
  - “Fullness of the Gentiles”?
  - “All Israel will be saved”?
2. Verse 29 says, “God’s gracious gifts and calling are irrevocable.”
  - What does this teach us about God’s faithfulness?
  - How does this encourage your confidence in God?
3. According to verses 30–32, what is God’s purpose in allowing disobedience?
4. Where do you see mercy emphasized in this section?

#### **Key Truth:**

God’s redemptive plan includes both Jews and Gentiles, and His covenant promises cannot fail.

### PART 2: GOD WILL BE GLORIFIED

Read Romans 11:33–36 together.

1. How does Paul respond to the mystery of God’s plan?
2. What words describe God in this passage?
3. Why do you think theology leads Paul to worship?

Verse 36 says: “For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things.”

#### Discuss:

- What does it mean that all things are *from* Him?
- *Through* Him?
- *To* Him?

#### Key Truth:

The ultimate goal of salvation history is the glory of God.



#### Live It

#### APPLICATION

1. Where do you need to trust God’s wisdom when you cannot trace His ways?
2. How can remembering God’s mercy shape how you treat others this week?
3. How can your life reflect “To Him be the glory forever”?



#### Prayer

Close in prayer, praising God for His mercy and sovereign wisdom.
