REVIEW IT

Paul continues using Israel as an illustration of God's sovereignty and faithfulness. Chapter 10 shows us what I need to become a witness to Christ's salvation.

1. I need a passion for salvation
2. I must understand the barriers to salvation
 - Zeal without knowledge
 - Self-righteousness
 - The good things we do
 - Christ
3. I need the essentials of salvation
4. I must get onboard with the process of salvation
 - God sends someone
 - They preach (witness)
 - Someone hears
 - They believe
 - They call on the name of the Lord
5. I must understand the rejection of salvation

Spend some time in the word: Read Romans chapter 10

TALK ABOUT IT

1. Paul describes four barriers to salvation in Romans 10. Which barrier do you see most often in your own life or the lives of those around you, and why do you think it's so common?
2. The sermon emphasizes the importance of both declaring with your mouth and believing in your heart. How do these two actions work together in a person's faith journey?
3. In what ways have you seen "zeal without knowledge" play out in our culture, and how can we respond to them with grace?
4. The image of God holding out His hands all day long is powerful. What does this picture of God's patience and love mean to you personally, and how might it shape the way you witness to others?
5. What else stood out to you from this message/Bible reading.

ACT ON IT

This week, begin praying again for a person or people who need to believe in Jesus. Pray for that person by name, asking God to open their heart and give you compassion and courage to be a witness. Trust that God is already working, and choose to join Him in the process of witness—just as someone once shared the good news with you.
