



How To Discover God's Will (Romans 12:1-5)

REVIEW IT

God's will is not a formula or a feeling. But four powerful principles from Romans 12:1-5 direct you to God's will for your life: Dedication, transformation, evaluation, and cooperation.

1. Dedicate your body to God

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.

2. Eliminate competing distractions

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

3. Evaluate your strengths

For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you.

4. Cooperate with other believers

For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

TALK ABOUT IT

1. What does it mean to dedicate your whole life to God, and how might that look in everyday life?
2. How can we avoid being shaped by the world's values while still living in it? What can insolation look like?
3. Why is it important to honestly evaluate ourselves as Christians? What would someone who is disconnected from a church body find in these Bible verses?
4. In what ways can we show love to God by caring for other believers in our church community?
