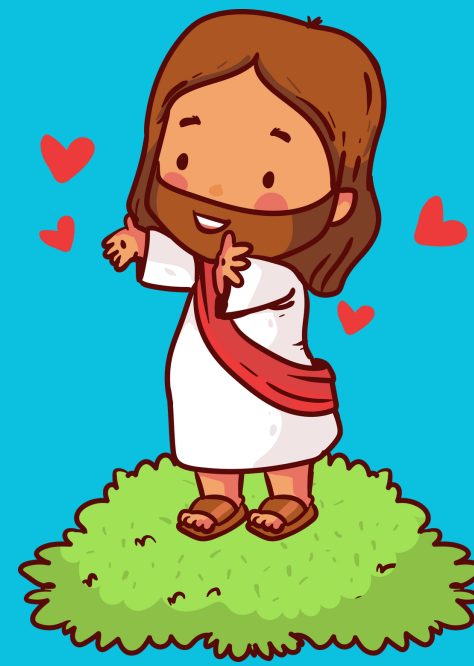


August Week 1 Curriculum

CRAFT: The Good Path

WHAT YOU SAY:

"As you work on your 'The Good Path' craft, let's think about something Jesus taught us. In this story, He talked about what our hearts can be like, they can be like different types of soil!

In Matthew 13:23 (NlrV), it says:

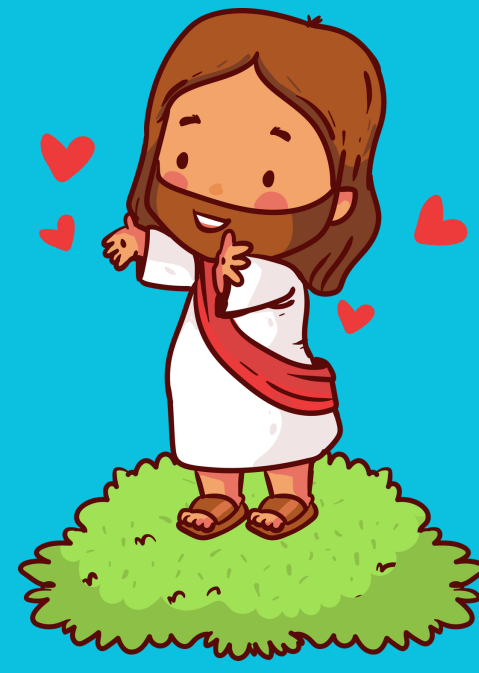
'But the seed that fell on good soil is like those who hear the message and understand it. They produce a crop 100, 60 or 30 times more than the farmer planted.'

The rocky soil is people who accept God's truth but quit when things get hard. The thorny soil is people who worry too much about other things. And the good soil is people who hear and understand what God is trying to teach them.

When we really listen and obey God, our hearts are like that good soil, and good things grow! People with soft hearts hear God's words. They read what God says in the Bible, listen to the Holy Spirit, talk to God about what they hear, and ask Him for help in everything.

Over time, people with soft hearts become more and more like Jesus through the power of God's Spirit inside them. That's how God's kingdom continues to grow more and more! Finally, always remember: God's kingdom grows when you hear and do what He says."

Here is what you need:



2



Use clay to make small rocks and place them along the first path, just like in the picture.

3



Stick the red circle onto the red heart.

4



Glue the sponges onto the second path (you can also use double-sided tape).

5



Stick the pink circle onto the pink heart.

6



Crumple up the brown tissue paper and glue it along the third path.

7



Stick the purple sticker onto the purple heart.

You are all done!
