

## Day 1: God's Light and Our Spiritual Darkness

Reflection: Identify one area of your life where you feel you are walking in darkness. How can you bring this area into the light through confession and seeking God's guidance today?

1 John 2:1-2 (ESV): "My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world."

Reflection: Consider how Jesus' role as your advocate impacts your relationship with God. How can you deepen this relationship through obedience and transformation today?

### Day 3: The Continuous Journey of Transformation

Our life's purpose is not fulfilled at the moment of surrender but is a continuous journey of transformation. We are encouraged to lay down our own plans and desires, allowing God to transform us into new creations. 1 John 2:5-6 (ESV): "But whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected. By this we may know that we are in him: whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked."
