**The Real – and Simple – Reason
our church can grow again!**

Dear friends in Christ,

A recent study asked “What *causes* someone to start attending church?” The answer is plain old-fashioned common sense! The unchurched start attending because they want to grow spiritually and because someone invited them. It’s the combination of spiritual and personal connections.

Unchurched people start attending regularly because of some spiritual hunger or curiosity or spiritual need for meaning or for God’s forgiveness. AND the spiritual prompt is coupled with the personal prompt. ***The unchurched start attending regularly because someone invited them*** (22%) and a spouse wants them to go (17%).

It’s not good music or charismatic preaching that draws the unchurched. Those factors tend to cause people who are already Christians to change churches. That’s what non-denominational mega-churches do. God’s Kingdom doesn’t grow from transfer growth. There won’t be more people in heaven and fewer in hell when Christians who already believe in Jesus change churches.

What the unchurched need is guidance by the Holy Spirit ***and a personal invitation***. While the former is only a work of God, the latter is easily accomplished by any size church in any location in the United States. **YOU** can do this! You can be instrumental in someone being in heaven forevermore! It’s as simple as a personal invitation.

People who already attend a church are the ones who tend to care more about worship style, programming, and denominational preferences than the unchurched. ***The top reason church people attend a particular church is because someone invited them.***

So, PRAY for God to touch the heart of your neighbor or relative or friend. Pray that God work in them a desire for God’s truth and God’s forgiving grace. AND ***invite them to come with you***. Offer to pick them up and drive. Offer to sit with them and explain what to expect in the church service. Introduce your guest to others after the church service. Maybe treat your guest to a restaurant where you can discuss what you both heard and you can answer questions.

Why not this Easter? A personal invitation is the most impactful way to motivate someone to start attending church. Invite. You may be the reason someone’s eternity is changed!

Artist is Making Birth of Christ window

Since its beginning in September 2025, members of St. Paul have enthusiastically embraced this program and have been donating generously for the stained glass windows. Funds have been received for 4 of the 6 windows and the first window is under construction. We are eager to see the first done, installed, and dedicated to God's glory. The projected date is by June 2026.

You still have the opportunity to participate in beautifying St. Paul's worship sanctuary. If you wish to give a memorial in memory of a loved one there is still time as we gather donations for the 2 remaining windows. Donations may be given in any amount, by individuals, or groups, for example, "from the Johnson family." Donors may remember their loved one with an inscription of a loved-one's name on our wall plaque

entitled, "Life of our Savior Stained Glass Windows have been Given in Memory of"

Your gifts may be given to "St. Paul Lutheran Church" and please add the note "for stained glass windows project." We will then contact you to discuss if your gift is in memory of a loved one and whom you would like memorialized. You may give via check, or through the church web site you may give by credit card or EFT.

The windows will enhance worship and serve the congregation for generations to come.

2024 Christmas Offering Designated for New Cause

Every Christmas the people of St. Paul give a special offering gift in thanks to God for giving us the best gift, His Son Jesus, our Savior. The gifts given in December 2024 were collected for the purpose of refurbishing the sanctuary pews. Approximately \$13,500 was donated to this cause by St. Paul people. The funds have not been spent because the project is much more costly than the amount collected.

At a recent Voters' Assembly meeting the question was raised whether that Christmas Offering money could be designated for a different cause – for stained glass windows.

The Board of Directors has searched the congregation's governing documents and finds no stipulation prohibiting the congregation from using the funds for a cause different than the one for which the funds were collected. In their February 2026 meeting, the Board of Directors decided to give individuals who do not want their donation to the 2024 Christmas Offering to be re-directed to the stained glass window project an opportunity to opt out.

If you contributed to the 2024 Christmas Offering which was gathered for the purpose of refurbishing pews, and you do not want your donation money re-directed to replace the sanctuary windows with stained glass, then please call or send an email to the church office (440/988-4157 office@stpaulamherst.com). In your request please state your name, the amount of your donation, and whether you want that amount returned to you or designated for a different cause in the church's ministry. Please make your request before Easter, April 5th, 2026.
