Which part of the sermon challenged you the most—your service, your speech, or the way you treat others? Why? Share a specific example from this past week where you see an opportunity to honor God more faithfully.

Jesus perfectly honored the Father's name and extended mercy instead of giving us what we deserved. How should that shape the way you respond to someone who has wronged you this week? Is there a relationship where you need to stop "keeping score" and instead reflect the grace you've received in Christ?
