Study Questions

Before answering these questions, take some time to read the passage from the sermon together or on your own.

What did this sermon tell us about God?

What did this sermon tell us about us as people?

What did you hear in this sermon that applied the most to your own life?

What stood out to you most about God's holiness and why? How might your view of God change if you consistently saw him as more holy than you currently do?

Why is it important to understand that holiness is a given identity before it is a lived-out lifestyle? Why do we often drift toward trying to earn God's acceptance? How does the gospel free us from that mindset? What is the difference between?

What would it look like for you to "live like someone who belongs to God" this week? Where is one specific area where God may be calling you to more clearly reflect the holiness of the One to whom you belong? "become God's people" and "living like God's people"?
