Study Questions

Before answering these questions, take some time to read the passage from the sermon together or on your own.

What did this sermon tell us about God?

What did this sermon tell us about us as people?

What did you hear in this sermon that applied the most to your own life?

The sermon described holiness as "a vision for life" rather than just a list of rules. What stood out to you most about that idea, and how does it challenge the way you normally think about holiness?

Leviticus 19 shows that holiness is practical and touches every area of life. Which area do you find most challenging right now—generosity, honesty, fairness, love, or something else? What makes that area difficult for you?

The sermon emphasized that God rescues his people before calling them to be holy. How does remembering that your relationship with God is based on his grace—not your performance—change the way you think about pursuing holiness this week?
