Study Questions

Before answering these questions, take some time to read the passage from the sermon together or on your own.

What did this sermon tell us about God?

What did this sermon tell us about us as people?

What did you hear in this sermon that applied the most to your own life?

“We often want God’s gifts without wanting the Giver.” Where are you most tempted to approach God primarily for what you want him to give you or do for you? What would it look like to desire God himself more?

The sermon described sin not merely as breaking rules but as relational rebellion—saying to God, “I know what you say, but I’m going to do what I want instead.” How does thinking about sin this way change its seriousness? Where are we tempted to think of ourselves as merely “occasionally noncompliant” rather than rebellious?

Where in your life are you currently tempted to say, “God, I know what you say, but I want to do this my way”? What would surrender look like in that area this week?
