Study Questions

Before answering these questions, take some time to read the passage from the sermon together or on your own.

What did this sermon tell us about God?

What did this sermon tell us about us as people?

What did you hear in this sermon that applied the most to your own life?

What is something you are tempted to look to for life, security, identity, or satisfaction besides God? Why is that thing so appealing? How have you seen the "backup savior" fail to deliver?

How does seeing atonement as God's gift rather than God's demand change the way you think about God's character, Jesus' death, or your relationship with him? Which part of the discussion about justice, mercy, and atonement stood out most to you and why?

The sermon argued that sin moves us away from the God who is life, while obedience moves us closer to him. What is one practical step you can take this week to pursue the life God offers instead of the life the world promises? Is there a specific area where God may be calling you to trust him rather than rely on a "Jesus plus _____" approach?
