Application Questions

1. Think of a situation when you are tempted to fall back on your own righteousness. How has that worked out for you? How would that compare to trusting in God's righteousness?
2. When is it hardest for you to rejoice in the Lord? How do you maintain a joyful countenance?
3. How do you use your gifts and talents for God's glory? Is there one that you have neglected that God could use for his kingdom purposes?
4. As believers, God's presence in our lives is what makes us distinct. How has His presence changed you? How would people know He lives within you?
5. How do you deal with guilt? How does it affect your relationship with God?
