3. Is there anything that competes for the worship you should be giving to God? Is there anything that needs to be re-aligned in your life?

4. What is something that Jesus has done for you that others need to know about? Who can you share it with this week?
5. What gives us joy is a reflection of what our heart loves. What gives you joy? Where does God's love, grace and redemption fall on that list?
