1. Who are the main characters in this text and is there anyone you can relate to?
2. Is there anything from this text that we are to do (obey, believe, heed or follow)?
3. What do you learn about God in these chapters and how has that changed what you believe about Him?
4. What do these passages reveal about human nature, sin and our need for God?
5. What's the Good News found in this text?

Every week, you'll see five unique application questions. Use them to help live out what you're learning in scripture. Pray for life transformation.

1. Which of the attributes listed in Psalm 89 is most meaningful to you? Spend time praising Him.
2. How does the ugliness of your sin help you better understand God's holiness?
3. When are you tempted to step into the role of hero in your own story? How do you keep God at the center instead?
4. Have you ever tried to hide your sin from God? How did that work out? How is God's omnipresence (God being present everywhere) for your good?
5. As you mature in Christ do you find yourself becoming more independent from or more dependent upon God's grace? How so? Which gives him the most glory?

God is faithful even when we are not. He is the only one worthy of our worship. There is no one like our God and that is good news.
