2. Is there anything from this text that we are to do (obey, believe, heed or follow)?

3. What do you learn about God in these chapters and how has that changed what you believe about Him?
4. What do these passages reveal about human nature, sin and our need for God?
5. What's the Good News found in this text?

Every week, you'll see five unique application questions. Use them to help live out what you're learning in scripture. Pray for life transformation.

1. What would it look like for you to do what is good and right and faithful before the Lord? Would anything have to change?
2. Do you listen to your fears more than your faith? Is there anything fear is keeping you from?
3. What has happened in your life that others might see and know that God alone is Lord?
4. How do you seek the good of your neighbor?
5. What spiritual gift are you using to build up the body of Christ?

God describes himself as the one who blots out our transgressions. He sent his Son Jesus to do just that. He alone is God! That is good news.
