2. Is there anything from this text that we are to do (obey, believe, heed or follow)?
3. What do you learn about God in these chapters and how has that changed what you believe about Him?
4. What do these passages reveal about human nature, sin and our need for God?
5. What's the Good News found in this text?

Every week, you'll see five unique application questions. Use them to help live out what you're learning in scripture. Pray for life transformation.

1. What circumstances is God using to refine you now? How will you live for his glory?
2. What has God's word accomplished in your life? What purposes has he fulfilled through you?
3. When was the last time you spent time recounting the steadfast love of the Lord? Who needs to be reminded of his steadfast love?
4. When have you suffered for doing right? What comfort does Jesus give you?
5. How does God's word shape the way you live, work, think, and do church?
