I would like to introduce you to our newest resident staff member, Ian. Ian was someone that was called to the Mission from far away. When he showed up at the Mission door he was broken and lost.

Ian tragically lost his wife of thirty-four years recently. I will not go into details other than to say that the passing of a life long spouse is a traumatizing thing to endure and her passing was traumatizing to Ian. Afterward he struggled to maintain normalcy of any sort but realized he had become an alcoholic when he found himself drinking at work.

He quit drinking, moved to another state but found that no matter the situation he was still lost. Now Ian had grown up in church but was never truly a servant of Jesus Christ. He found himself looking for answers so he sold the last of his possessions to buy a bus ticket to a part of the country he had never heard of before, Coos Bay.

I can tell you that Ian's journey to the Mission was providential and he was eager to enter our discipleship program. Praise God he brought Ian here and I have faith that Ian is on his journey to healing and a new purpose in life, Jesus Christ.
